Overall, the rules will be clear, consistent & positive and students will be given recognition for their good choices. Learning and understanding the consequences will decrease the chance of the rule being broken again.

believe learning should be about discovery and exploration. I like - children to get up out of their desks, come together and share as a community. I use a variety of teaching techniques such as small & large groups, independent seat work, and learning centers.

I will plan the curriculum to meet individual needs and interests. I will also be flexible enough to allow for the unexpected occurrences or teachable moments that may arise. I will have both long- & short- range plans, but will remain open to change in both activities and teaching strategies.

The kindergarten curriculum has changed greatly over the years and can be at times seen as quite academically driven. It is my goal for each kindergartener to be ready for first grade, whether you plan on continuing with our school or elsewhere. Therefore, it's important for me to be aware of the district's kindergarten curriculum but at the same time provide a balanced curriculum that includes playtime, social interactions & crafts. I like to think of my classroom as a happy medium between the kindergarten classrooms of yesterday and the academic driven classes of today.

Furthermore, students are encouraged to work at their own pace. Throughout the day, students will be divided into small groups. These groups will allow me to give more

individualized attention and I can tailor an assignment to meet the needs of the child.

I also don't like to rush my students. The ability to read by the end of kindergarten is not a requirement. Instead, I take each child as he or she enters kindergarten and take each child as far as he or she will go within one school year knowing that learning rates vary greatly.

Through the year, I want my students to master their letters & letter sounds and develop the skills needed for reading. Students will spend time on phonemic awareness: listening to and creating rhymes, identifying beginning and ending word sounds, and hopefully by the end of the year sounding out, spelling and reading three-letter words.

Overall, kindergarten is a time to provide a smooth transition from home or preschool to elementary school. A balanced curriculum is used that includes not only academic areas, but also enhances social, spiritual, emotional and physical areas as well.
