## CLASSROOM SPOTLIGHT: TK— 1ST GRADES Learning About History

ur Tk/K-1<sup>st</sup> grade class started a new social studies this month on Native Americans. . They are focusing on 4 different tribes across our nation: the Tlingit tribe from the Pacific Northwest, the Sioux from the Plains, the Navajo from the Southwest, and Iroquois from the Northeast. Students have been learning about their cultures, traditions and different characteristics of each nation including their main source of food, the homes they live in, and clothes they wear. It has been very interesting to see the differences of each tribe and how their location on the map influences their way of life. Students have

made colorful Navajo paintings inspired by woven rugs, a turquoise & silver necklace made from noodles & tin foil, and a tee pee covered in Native American symbols. Next week students will finish their latest unit by decorating corn and comparing their lives to those of the Native Americans.
