### Daylight Savings Fun Facts

- Daylight savings (DLS) was first conceived by Benjamin Franklin.
- On March 19, 1918, the Standard Time Act Established time zones and DLS.
- In 2007, a new law extended DLS to the first Sunday in November with the purpose that trick-or-treaters would have more light and more safety from traffic accidents.
- Amtrak trains cannot leave a station before the scheduled time. So, when clocks fall back one hour, all Amtrak trains in the U.S. stop at 2:00 a.m. and wait one hour before running. In the spring, they instantaneously become an hour late and must do their best to make up time.
- In the U.S., Hawaii and most of Arizona do not follow DLS.
- About 70 countries around the world observe DLS.

### CLASSROOM SPOTLIGHT: Grades 5-6 Learn to Read at Deeper Level

he 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> Grade Class has been reading and loving it. The class is divided into four groups and is assigned a book to read. Students then discuss the topic of the book and learn from each other what they are reading.
