CLASSROOM SPOTLIGHT: 5th-6th Are Already Learning A Lot!

he 5th-6th grade are learning a lot this year! In bible we are learning how God transforms us. At the beginning of the unit the students were given a brown flower pot. They had to describe what the flower pot looked like. Then students were given the opportunity to pick fabric to glue on to their pot. They then had to describe how that fabric changed their brown pot into something beautiful. The same is true with God. When we invite Jesus into our lives he takes our old selves and
